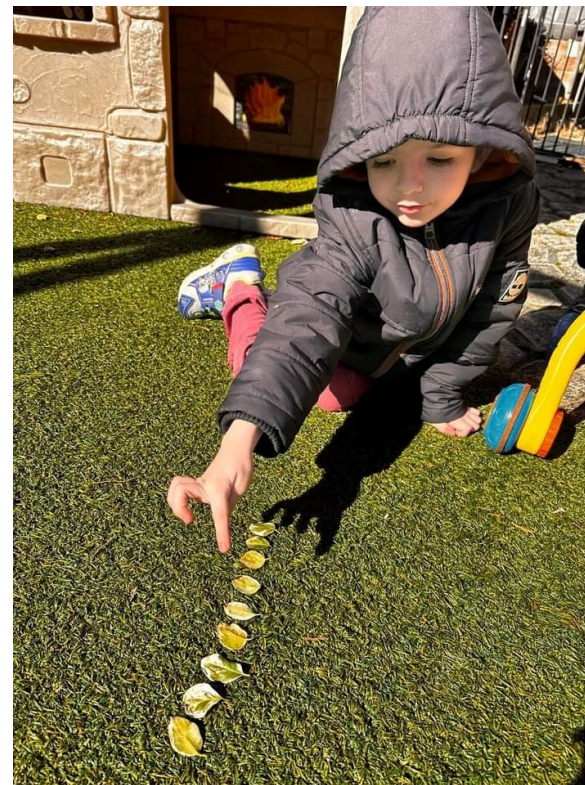
Please make sure your child has all the necessary items to enjoy their day; including change of clothes and rain boots for those muddy spring days.

**Child Find Notice**

It is the responsibility of the Beverly Public Schools to identify any child who is a resident of Beverly or who attends a private school in Beverly who may have a disability. This includes students who are residents of Beverly who are homeschooled.

It is also the responsibility of the Beverly Public Schools to evaluate those students to determine if they are eligible for special education or related services under IDEA (Individuals with Disabilities Education Act) or 603 CMR 28 (Massachusetts Special Education Regulations), or who may be eligible under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

If you suspect that your school-aged child has a disability, you may request an evaluation, at no cost, at your neighborhood school. Please contact the principal at your neighborhood school for information about referring your child or the Special Education Office at 978-921-6100 x21735.

The Beverly Public Schools is committed to identifying children before their third birthday that may need special education services. If you have questions or concerns that your child under 3 may have a disability, please contact Gina Anderson at 9778-921-6100 x21741.
