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Infant - Fall and Leaves Our class will focus on the leaves changing colors, all the colors of fall, and farm animals. The children will glue leaves and explore red, orange, and vellow paint to make fall art and feel the textures of the leaves. Infant/Toddler - Classroom Routines The children will develop a sense of the daily routine in the classroom. We will work together to help wash hands, clean up our toys, do expressive art projects, and eat lunch. During expressive art we will use our hands and feet to paint for a new sensory experience. The children will utilize their sensory bins and scoops and fill them with grass, noodles, water, sand, and animals. We will continue to play outside and also have lots of fun in our new gym! Toddler - Thanksgiving, Fall, and Harvest Our class will focus on the arriving Fall season, how thankful we are for all the things this year has brought, and all that is yet to come. We will sing songs by our current favorite singer Laurie Berkhart and more. The children will continue with morning circle time, which helps to teach everyone our names and encourage our friends to greet one another. We can't wait to explore expressive art opportunities with the colors and textures of autumn! During sensory time we will play with leaves and pinecones and carve pumpkins and gourds. Toddler/Pre - Feelings This month, we will explore our emotions, how to express them appropriately, and how to self-regulate. As November is a time of harvest and Thanksgiving, the kids will especially learn about being thankful. In expressive art we will work with different sensory experiences such as the colors of autumn, the crunching of the fall leaves, and the scents of different herbs. The children will read books from Elizabeth Verdicks' social-emotional series and sing "When You're Happy and You Know It." Thank you, Miss Katie & Mr. Josh





Pre1 - Up In The Trees! Our class will focus on birds, insects, and weather/habit changes we see in our environment in the fall. They will sing "Autumn Leaves Are Falling Down" by The Kiboomers, "The Affirmations Song" by Doggyland, and do children's yoga. The children will focus on how to be a kind friend, learn about others' emotions, and will read This Is Our House by Michael Rosen. The natural materials from our environments will inspire our bird/fall art and we will use travs & tables for some messy sensory fun! Our outdoor experiences will take us through our school's woods trails on Tuesdays and Fridays, as well as our outdoor classroom. Thank you, Miss Gia & Miss Cassie





Pre2 - Learning About Our Community Helpers

Our classroom will focus on the people in our community such as firefighters, police, and EMT, etc., who help us stay safe and learn the roles they play in our lives. We will sing "Here Comes the Fire Truck" by Simple Songs and "Police Keeps Us Safe" by Little Angel Kids. For social-emotional learning, the kids will work on calming our bodies when we feel angry or frustrated and read Cranky Right Now! by Dan G. We will create tracks in the sand with fire trucks and police cars and fingerpaint with red and yellow paint. During sensory play the kids will "put out the fire" with shaving cream, fire trucks, and food coloring. Our sensory bin will be "doctor themed" and be filled with cotton balls and "doctor supplies". Our outdoor experiences will include different stations such as a doctor's office, fire station, and police station! PreK - Food & Nutrition Our class will focus on nutrition and making healthy food choices. Through books, hands on activities, real food, and pictures the children will learn about food and where it comes from. For music & movement the kids will dance to "Good Foods" by Jack Hartmann. We will continue with our Second Step curriculum and read *How Are* You Peeling? Foods with Moods by Freymann & Elffers, For expressive art they will paint with beets and create collages with beans and lentils. We will be taste testing a variety of new foods.
