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Infant - Colors, Shapes, & Textures The children will focus on building fine motor, communication, and social interaction skills. We will sing and move to nursery rhymes and the song "Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star" by Raffi, clapping and swaying. We will read Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See? by Bill Martin Jr. to encourage recognition and interaction. Finger painting with safe, edible paints and exploring crayons for scribbling will be lots of fun during our expressive art. We will explore different textures with our toys, soft fabric, and sensory bins with water and rice. Our outdoor time will consist of exploring nature and playing with bubbles in the fresh air. Infant/Toddler - New Art Tools and How Toys Work Our class will focus on relationships in the classroom, learning our environment, identifying our own cubbies, using new art tools, and exploring our lunch foods. We will dance to "We Are the Dinosaurs" by The Laurie Berkner Band, "Five Little Monkeys Jumping on the Bed" by Cocomelon, and "ABCs". They will utilize all parts of the curriculum to build trust and relationships. For expressive art we will introduce sensory art projects for the children to create art with their bodies and explore art tools with our new friends. The kids will gather leaves for art projects and make tape nature bracelets. Thank you, Miss Shauna & Miss Cassie

Toddler - The Spirit of Giving For the month of December, following last month's theme of harvest and thankfulness, we will focus on the spirit of giving. We celebrate our diverse community and give to each other some of the wonderful things we've received this year. During music, the kids will listen to an array of winter holiday songs from The Nutcracker Ballet with songs that celebrate winter weather, such as "Winter Wonderland" by Felix Bernard, and from the movie Frozen, "Do You Want to Build a Snowman?" For art, our class will paint and cut out with different colors and materials that embrace the season. For sensory play, we will experiment with ice melting, crunchy leaves, the bare bark of trees that lost their leaves, and more. Thank you, Miss Mariah & Isa





**Toddler/Pre - The Environment** This month, the children will explore environmental differences that come with the changing of the seasons. Winter animal habitats and hibernation will be investigated. The kids will dance to music with wind streamers and create expressive art with natural items discovered on our playscape and in our woods and wetlands. We will have discussions about how the new weather makes us feel each day. There will be leaves, ice, and hopefully snow in our sensory table for experiments. We will also work on clearing our conservation land trails. Thank you, Miss Katie & Mr. Josh

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**Pre1 - Discovering Light & Dark** We will focus on the contrast between light and dark as the sun begins to rise/set earlier each day. We'll also tie in how animal habitats change as the seasons do. For music & movement we will do yoga by Cosmic Kids, the "Doggyland" affirmation songs & "We're Going On a Bear Hunt" by The Kiboomers. The kids will continue to learn and understand different emotions and how to handle them and read *Goodnight Moon* by Margaret Wise Brown. During expressive art, we will explore the contrast of light &and dark through painting, making collages, and more! Flashlight and translucent toys will be used for some light-up fun and our outside materials will be used in the sensory tables. Thank you, Miss Gia & Miss Bella





Pre2 - Animals that Hibernate In The Winter and Those That Do Not Our class will learn about hibernation, which animals hibernate, and why they hibernate. They will discuss the animal tracks we discover in the woods, near the school, and in our neighborhoods. For music and movement the kids will sing "Adventure Through The Snow" by Fun Educational Songs and for social-emotional learning, will read *Over and Under The Snow* by Katie Messner and *The Reflection in Me* by Marc Colagiovanni. The children will make animal shelters out of materials we collect during our woods walk and make animal tracks with paint and playdough. During sensory time we will fill our sensory table with cotton balls and small animal figures and also with white sand with winter figures and tools to practice our pouring skills. We will be walking through our nature-based playground looking for animal tracks and will create our own animal shelter in the woods. Thank you, Miss Jess & Mrs. Edylay

**PreK - Shapes and Colors All Around Us** The children will explore symmetry and patterns by using different shapes, colors, and materials. They will observe 3D shapes in nature and through STEM activities, and be encouraged to build bridges, steady structures with assorted materials such as wooden blocks, rocks, and tree branches. Through the series of *Elmer* books by David McKee, the children will learn to embrace their uniqueness and the nature of friendships and family. "Shape Songs" by Jack Hartmann will help visualize shapes through movements and singing. Thank you, Miss Irena & Miss Ranjana
