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Infant - Winter Sensory Exploration! The children will be learning about winter and exploring the snow. We will watch the snow melting! <u>Infant/Toddler - Natural Resources and Color!</u> This month our class will focus on groundhogs, experimenting with colors, friendship, and kindness. The children will dance to "I'm a Little Groundhog" by the Kiboomers and read *The First Words of Love* by Jean Claude and other books about friendship and kindness. For expressive art we will put colors on paper towels then add water from water droppers to see how the colors change and explore them. For outdoor experiences, the children will bird watch and gather pine cones to make bird feeders and will paint with other natural resources. 

Toddler/Pre - All About Me At the end of January, we welcomed Miss Yani into the class as the co-teacher! Our class will focus on each child and what makes them unique. For music and movement we will sing "all about me" songs. For social-emotional learning we will read all about me books such as *I Like Myself* by Karen Beaumont and *Only One You* by Linda Kranz. For expressive art we will be doing self portraits and exploring how different items, places and people make us feel. When we go outside, we will learn about how different situations make us feel. Pre2 - Friends & Emotions For the month of February, the children will work on understanding our friends' emotions, learning self-awareness, responsible decision-making, relationship skills, self-management, and social awareness. We will listen to the "Feelings Song" by Diane Albert and read Words Are Not For Hurting by Elizabeth Verdick. The children will "paint" the emotion they are feeling and will discuss how their creations make them feel. We will make sensory emotion bays that will help the kids self-regulate as well as help them identify their emotions. PreK - Friendship & Kindness For the month of February, the children will explore the themes of friendship and kindness. They will be encouraged to participate in group activities, collaborate with each other to create and build together, and become better listeners to each other's ideas. Second Step curriculum will help reinforce some of those friendship ideas through simple scenarios with puppets, songs, and discussions. Some of the books that we will read are *A House for The Hermit Crab* by Eric Carle, *Stick and Stone* by B. Ferry & T. Lichtenheld, and songs such as "The Sharing Song" by Raffi.
